## Work Experience

Juniors and seniors in high school are wanted for internship and work experience positions. Students in college can do internships. Area employers work with WIA to provide a supportive environment for learning good work habits. WIA will assess youth interests and needs and place each individual accordingly. WIA pays all wages and workers comp, while the employer provides experience on the job and a supportive supervisor. Youth can work up to 10 hours a week while in school, and 24 hours a week or more during the summer.

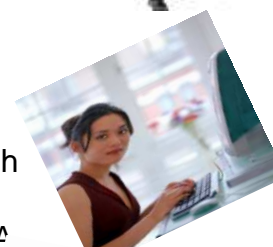


## Classroom Training & Dual Credit

WIA provides financial assistance with tuition, books, fees, and mileage. Once eligible, a student who maintains good grades and attendance, can receive financial assistance throughout a course of study, up to a two year degree.

## Dual Credit

The WIA Dual Credit Program is offered to WIA eligible high school seniors. Youth seeking assistance with expenses for dual credit courses must meet WIA income eligibility guidelines to qualify for this program. Dual credit courses eligible for WIA assistance can be for vocational purposes. The training provider provides an ongoing, updated listing of its dual credit course offerings. WIA will not pay for courses that are already funded by the local school districts. Approved dual credit program participants are eligible to receive WIA funds for books, tuition, supplies and mileage.



## GED (GED Incentive)

Students who have been in a GED program for 4 weeks are eligible to participate in the GEDI program. WIA provides mileage assistance to GED classes and pays a \$100 bonus upon successful completion of the GED. Students can work 10 hours per week while in classes and then 20 hours a week after the GED is earned, up to a maximum of 520 hours total.
